A guide on how to separate garbage

Kan-onji city

First

Mass production and consumption accompanied by economical development has contributed to our quality of life and increased convenience, however it has also led to deep social problems such as negatively affecting our environment due to excessive waste. Additionally, these elements have contributed to the increasing lack of disposal facilities.

In order to make sustainable recycling a reality in our society, we need to reduce our emission of waste by following laws that aim to promote the establishment of a society that sustainably recycles properly and smoothly. Once we do that, then we must promote recycling.

Based on 3R's system, we integrate classification of garbage into 3 classes with 14 items in all of these areas. Since April 2015, we have been using this system in an effort to reduce and recycle wastes.

In order to promote reducing garbage and recycling by proper garbage sorting and in an effort to stand by Kan-onji's slogan- "A city that takes good care of its resources and recycles, we made this easy-to-read guidebook." This guidebook should help us gain your understanding and cooperation for garbage separation and guide you on how to put out various types of waste.

Reduce = try to create as little garbage as possible
Let's reduce garbage

Reuse = try to use things multiple times if at all possible
Let's use things many times

Recycle = turning garbage into something useful
Let's use it as resources

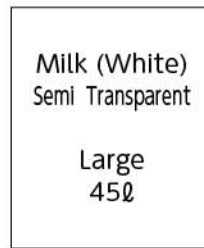

Burnable garbage	Collective name for food, paper, leathers, clothes, rubber, wood, flowers, gun powders, and other wastes found on page 3
Non-burnable garbage	Collective name for metals which can not be recycled such as glass bottles, plastics, glasses, ceramics, and other wastes found on page 4
Recyclable waste	On page 5 to 11 (12 items) Plastics, glass bottles, cans, PET bottles, metals, clothes, newspapers and flyers, magazines and other papers, cardboards, cut branches, batteries, and small household electrical appliances.

About a designated garbage bag of Kan-onji city

Please put garbage in designated plastic bags to discard.

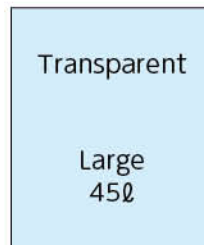

How to purchase

These transparent or semitransparent trash bags can be purchased at supermarkets, DIY shops, and other general stores.

Caution

Please make sure to sort before putting out garbage.

Please put out on the designated days of the week, in the correct place, **by 8 a.m.**

Please don't put garbage out before the collection day or after 8 a.m. of collection day.

Other types of bags are not accepted.

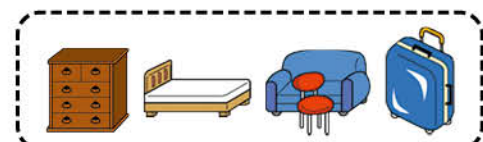
If you put out too much garbage (cut branches, futon, etc.) at a time, we may not be able to collect.

Waste below can not be collected, the Consumer Environment Protection Division will accept them for a fee. **If you want to know about carry-away garbage, please refer to the back cover .**

A lot of garbage created by house-moving or cleaning, oversized garbage like chests, beds, sofas, suitcases, etc. (Bikes and small household appliances such as electrical fans can be collected.)

Oversized garbage

Defined as garbage that is **60cm or larger** in width, height, or depth.



How to put out burnable garbage



White colored semi transparent bag

Put in bags or bind with string.

Food put in bags



- ▶ Non-edible things such as bones, shells, peels, food waste, etc. Drain it well.
- ▶ Foods which are expired best before date Remove the food from the container and drain well.
- ▶ Cooking oil Use a coagulating agent or soak it with newspaper or cloth if the amount is small.



Paper put in bags



- ▶ Paper cups, tissue paper, disposable diapers, box of detergent, dirty paper, etc. Please remove filth from diapers.

Leathers put in bags



- ▶ Bags, shoes, wallets, belts, jackets, gloves, etc. Remove if there are some metal fittings.

Clothes put in bags or bind with string



- ▶ Dirty clothes, towels, stuffed animals, cushions, blankets, etc. Fold futon and blankets to a maximum size of 60cm and bind.
- ▶ Bags, shoes, curtains, etc. Remove if there are some metal fittings.

Rubber items put in bags or bind with string



- ▶ Rain boots, rubber gloves, balls, hoses, rubber strings, rubber bands, etc. Release air from the ball. Cut hoses into about the length shorter than 60cm long and bind.

Wood bind with string



- ▶ Chests, tables, brooms, etc. Disassemble and cut it shorter than 60cm long and bind. Remove if there are any metal fittings of nails.

Grass and flowers put in bags



- ▶ Fallen leaves, small branches, grass, flowers Remove dirt from them.

Gun powder put in bags



- ▶ Matches, fireworks Finish using gun powders or soak well in water in order to safely dispose of.

Others put in bags



- ▶ Food wrap, medicines such as pills, kairo (disposable chemical body warmer), ice packs, etc. Take medicines out from the containers. Finish using kairors or soak them in water before putting out.

How to put out non-burnable garbage



Transparent bag

When the garbage is too big to put in a bag, put it in a plastic basket at a garbage collection spot.

Metal put in bags

- ▶ Polluted or eroded drink cans made of aluminium or steel which can not be recycled
- ▶ Charred utensils ▶ Stained can



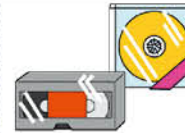
Glass bottles put in bags

- ▶ Polluted or cracked glass bottles of food which can not be recycled
- ▶ Glass bottles of things other than food (example cosmetics, hair liquid, ointment cream, etc.)



Plastics put in bags

- ▶ Polluted plastics which have a "プラ" sign
 - ▶ Containers of food, such as tubes, which cannot be cleaned with water
 - ▶ Plates, washbowls, hangers, clothespins, baskets, stationery, toothbrushes, straws, etc.
 - ▶ Dirty PET bottles which can not be recycled
 - ▶ Cassette tapes, video tapes, CDs, DVDs
- Caution :** Remove the tapes from the case and put it in a bag separate from other garbage.
- ▶ Tapes, CD and DVD cases, toys, plastic gas cans, plastic buckets, etc.



Glasses and Ceramics put in bags

- ▶ Plates, glasses, flower vases, pots, etc.



Other garbage put in bags

- ▶ Fluorescent lights, bulbs, cigarette lighters, etc.

Caution 1 : Please finish using the gas or let the gas out from the lighter.

One way to let the gas out is to break the ignition parts.

Caution 2 : If the gas is still in, please don't mix with other garbage.

Make sure to put it in another bag and put out.



How to put out recyclable waste



How to put out plastic waste

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put garbage in a transparent bag

Plastics which have a “プラ” sign, cleaned with water

Containers of instant noodles and detergent, packages of snacks and frozen food, trays of meat and fish, etc.



Cartons of eggs, tubes of mayonnaise, plastic bags, styrofoam, cups of PET bottles, etc.



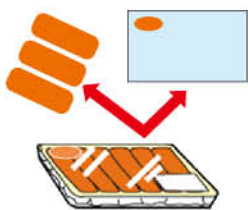
Refer to page 3 (burnable garbage) and page 4 (non-burnable garbage) to check exceptions.

Dirty tubes, containers of food, wraps, etc.

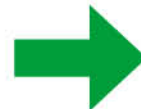


How to put out

Take out the contents.



Wash with water and remove the stains.



Put into designated garbage bags. (transparent 45L)

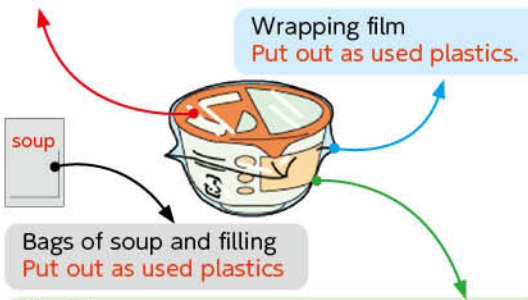


Example of separating wrapping

(Example) Instant noodle

Lid of the cup
If it is made of plastic, put out as used plastics.
If it is made of paper, put out as paper.

Wrapping film
Put out as used plastics.



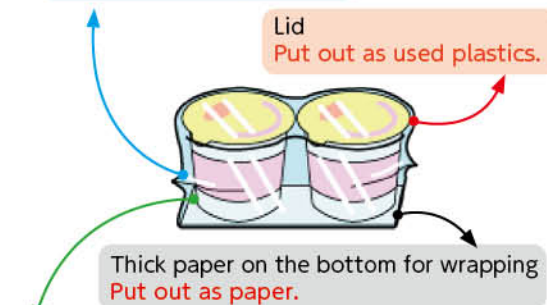
Bags of soup and filling
Put out as used plastics

Containers
If it is made of plastic, put out as used plastics.
If it is made of paper, put out as paper.

(Example) Yogurt

Wrapping film
Put out as used plastics.

Lid
Put out as used plastics.



Thick paper on the bottom for wrapping
Put out as paper.

Containers
If it is made of plastics, put out as used plastics.
If it is made of paper, put out as paper.

Wash containers, bags of soup and fillings with water in order to remove stains.

How to put out glass bottles

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put them in a plastic basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.

◎ Glass bottles of drink and seasonings that are cleaned with water

Bottles of juice, liquor, beer, soy sauce, etc.



✗ Refer to page 4 (non-burnable garbage) to check for exceptions.

Dirty or cracked glass bottles of food which can not be recycled
Glass bottles of things other than food, such as cosmetics



● Example

Remove caps and contents from the bottle.



Wash with water to remove stains.



Put it into a collection basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.



Category of cap differs depending on its material.

There is no need to separate by colors.

How to put out cans

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put them in a collection basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.

◎ Cans of drink or something that has a 「アルミ」 or 「スチール」 sign that are cleaned with water are categorized as this.



Cans of juice, tea, coffee, beer, canned food, etc.



✗ Refer to page 4 (non burnable garbage) to check for exceptions.

Dirty or eroded drink cans made of aluminium or steel
Cans of things other than food and drinks



● Example

Remove contents from the can.



Wash with water to remove stains.



Put it in a plastic basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.



There is no need to separate aluminium cans and steel cans.

How to put out PET bottles

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put them in a plastic basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.

- PET bottles of drink or seasonings which have "PET" signs that are cleaned with water. Bottles of juice, tea, soy sauce, etc.

Bottles of juice, tea, soy sauce, etc.



- ✗ Refer to page 4 (non-burnable garbage) and page 5 (used plastics) to check exceptions.

Polluted PET bottles which can not be recycled, caps of PET bottles, etc.



● Example

Remove a cap and contents from the PET bottles.



Caps are categorized as used plastics.

Wash with water to remove stains.



Put it into a plastic basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.



How to put out metals

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put them in a collection basket or designated place at a garbage collection spot.

- Utensils, cans for other than food, cans for sweets, metal fittings



- Wires, chains, golf clubs, metal parts of umbrellas, knives, scissors, etc.



Caution: Don't dismantle umbrellas. When you put out knives, use towels or newspapers to wrap the blade and put them in another collection basket at the garbage collecting site.

- Bicycles and Tricycles etc.

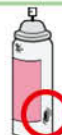


Limited to only 1 at a time.



Caution: Before you put out bikes, make sure to remove the registration, at police stations.

- Cans of spray and gas canisters, etc.



Poke a hole



Caution: Use up the contents and poke a hole, then put it in another plastic basket at the garbage collecting site.

- ✗ Refer to page 12 (Difficult items to dispose of properly) to check for exceptions.



Metals for construction such as galvanized iron sheets, aluminium sashes
Parts for cars or motorcycles, such as wheels
Dangerous goods such as fire extinguishers and gas cylinders

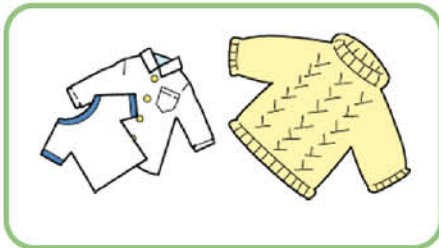
How to put out clothes

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Put garbage in a transparent bag. **Don't bind with strings.**

○ Clothes which are in good condition that can be used again if they are cleaned
Business shirts, T shirts, sweaters, jackets, skirts, jeans, suits, etc.

✗ Refer to page 3 (burnable garbage) to check for exceptions.

Polluted or torned clothes, panty hose, futon, clothes for animals



How to put out newspapers and flyers

Day to put out = Burnable garbage collection day

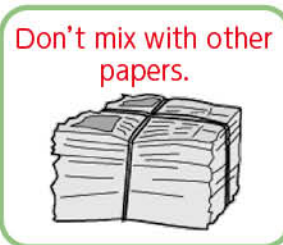
Bind crosswise with string or put in a newspaper collecting bag to put out.

Caution: Don't use packaging tape or semi transparent garbage bags.

When you put out, in order to recycle properly, please try to put away from the net or basket at the garbage collecting site.

○ Only newspapers and flyers

● Example



How to put out magazines and other papers

Day to put out = Burnable garbage collection day

Bind crosswise with strings or put in a magazine collecting bags or paper bags to dispose.

Caution: Don't use packaging tape or semi transparent garbage bags.

When you put it out, in order to recycle properly, try to put it away from the net or basket at the garbage collecting site.

○ Books such as paperbacks, comic books, catalogs, etc.

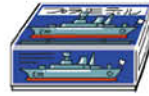
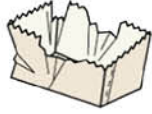
Caution 1: If the catalogs are wrapped in plastic, remove the plastic.

Caution 2: There is no need to separate books by their types.

◎ Other papers

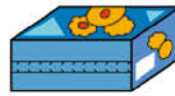
Papers which have “紙” sign such as copy paper, wrapping paper, paper bags, etc.

Cups of instant noodles, box of sweets, box of surgical masks, etc.



Caution: Fold paper boxes. Wash cups of instant noodles with water to remove stains and fold.

Paper bags, wrapping papers, boxes of tissue paper, etc.



Fold

Caution : Remove plastics on envelopes and tissue boxes .
If handles of paper bags are made of materials other than paper, please remove the handle.

Bind crosswise with strings or put in a paper bag.



Don't put them into a semi transparent garbage bag.



Shredded paper (Put in a semi transparent bag)

Caution : Shredded paper is to be put in a semi transparent garbage bag to put out.
Please don't mix with other things such as shredded disks.

◎ Paper packs have “紙パック” sign.

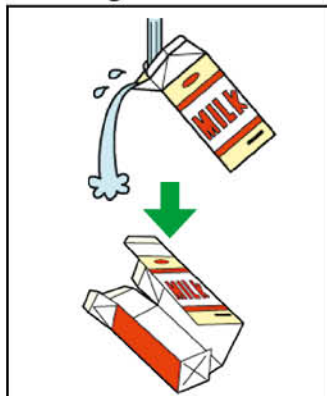
• Milk, juice, sake, liquor, soy milk, etc.



Example

(How to tell them apart) If you look down the straw hole of a 200cc paper pack, you can see whether there is silver colored aluminum or not.

Wash with water and tear off the glued sections.

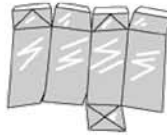


If the color inside is white

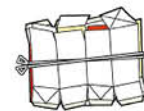


Cut them and open

Don't put them into a semi transparent garbage bag.



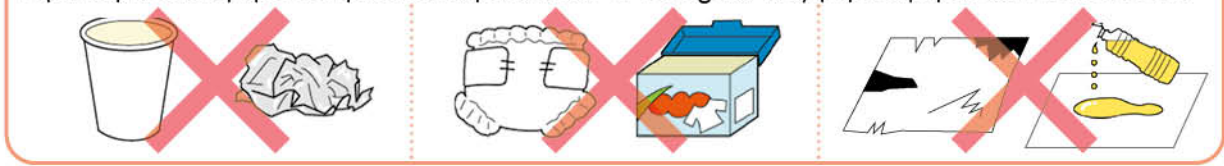
Put out with other papers



Caution: Please remove the plastic spout, such as the kind on sake packs.

Paper cups, tissue papers, disposable diapers, boxes of detergent, dirty papers, papers which absorb oils



How to put out cardboards

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

Fold and put out. If the amount is large, bind and tie them crosswise.

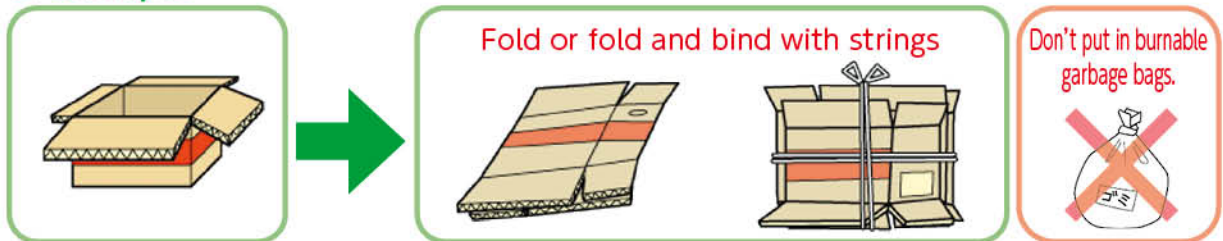
Caution: Don't use packaging tape. Don't shred and put them in a burnable garbage bag.

When you put them out, in order to recycle properly, try to put them away from the net or basket at the garbage collection site.

◎ Basic clean cardboards which have **ダンボール** mark and cardboards which are made with a cross section zigzag



● Example



How to put out cut branches

Day to put out = Burnable garbage collection day

Cut them into a maximum 60cm long and bind with string.

Caution: Don't use packaging tape or use burnable garbage bags.

◎ **Cut branches of trees in homes are categorized in.**

Caution1: Tree trunks can not be accepted regardless of their sizes. See the back cover.
Caution2: We can not collect too many branches at a time.



How to put out batteries

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

or designated boxes in your region.

Put them into battery collecting boxes or designated collection baskets or places at garbage collection sites.

◎ **Batteries, alkaline cells, lithium batteries, and button batteries**



▶ Place of battery collecting box

City office, branches of city office, community center, and meeting points, etc.

Caution: Places differ depending on the region.

* You can use battery collecting boxes any time

How to put out small household electrical appliances

Day to put out = Non-burnable garbage collection day

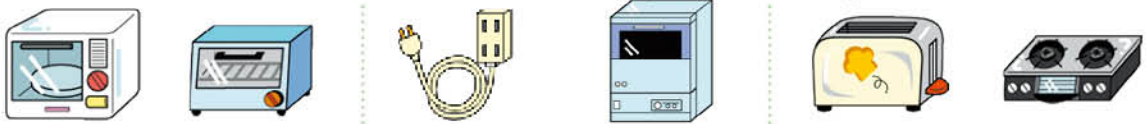
Put them in a designated place at a garbage collection spot.

◎ Small electrical appliances

Flip phones, telephones, small stereo speakers, calculators, fax machines, dryers, electrical razors, etc.



Microwaves, electric cookers, cords, small dish dryers, toasters, gas stoves, etc.



Lights, electronic light stands, vacuum cleaners, irons, sewing machines, radios, etc.



Electronic heaters, gas heaters, kerosine heaters, electronic fans, rice cookers, air cleaners, etc.



✗ Things which are not applicable

Things that apply to home appliance recycling systems or PC recycling systems



About garbage that can not be accepted by the city

Kan-onji city has revised a regulation about waste management and public cleansing on October 1st of 2019 and designated "difficult items to dispose of properly".

Kan-onji city neither collects, nor accepts, as carry on garbage.

Ask the designated collecting operators, dealers you bought items, or waste disposal companies when you dispose of listed items.

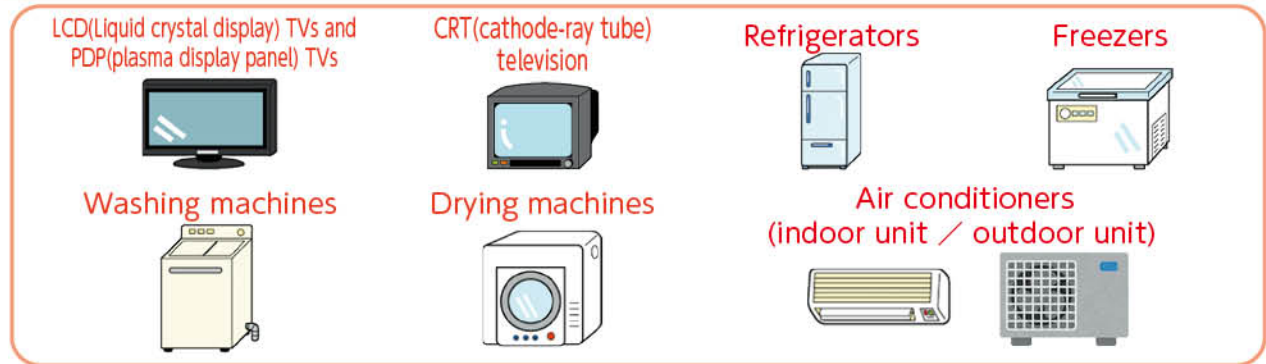

Things which are subject to the recycle law of household electrical appliances: (Caution) OLED TVs is excluded



▶ How to dispose

- ① Bring the items to the store that you bought the items from (You must pay a recycling fee). Ask the store how to pay the recycling fee and where to place your items.
- ② Take the items into the designated recycling appliances collecting site (You must pay a recycling fee) Check with the manufacturer, pay the recycling fee at the post office, and bring a recycling ticket.

Things subject to PC recycle law



▶ How to dispose

PCs sold from October 2003 or later that have a PC recycle mark.

As a principal, they can be collected and recycled with no additional recycling fee when you dispose. Directly ask manufacturers for further information.

Manufacturers cooperate with JAPAN POST and are collecting PCs by using “eko Yu-pack”.

Things subject to two-wheeled vehicle recycle law



▶ How to dispose

Ask Motorcycle Recycling dealer (Marked sticker above)

Things subject to automobile recycle law:



End-of-life vehicle recycling law was put into practice in 2005. Ask car dealers for more information.

Introductions of ways in which we can easily put waste practices into action so that we can achieve the goal of Kan-onji's slogan- "A city that takes good care of its resources and recycles."

Choose items that you can use for a long time.

Let's choose good products that we can use for a long time with care. Before you buy something, please consider any alternatives first and verify that the purchase is really necessary.

Choose refillable products.

Let's choose products that are refillable. If you buy refillable dishwashing detergent, it reduces garbage by 30 g per bottle.

Let's avoid excessive packaging.

Excessive packaging causes waste. Let's avoid buying items that use excessive packaging. Choose food that is sold in individual pieces or sold by weight to ensure that it is all being consumed.

Choose products that are environmentally friendly.

Let's choose recycled products that have eco-marks or green-marks.



When items break, attempt to fix them.

Let's consider if broken items can be fixed before we throw them away. Toys and home appliances often can be fixed.

Give to those in need.

When we have items that we don't need anymore, let's give those items to others or sell them at flea markets.

Let's use reusable shopping bags.

When you go shopping, let's carry reusable shopping bags and avoid buying plastic bags.

It is also a good idea to not get a plastic bag at a convenience store if you are only purchasing a few items.

Taking these actions will reduce garbage by about 10 g per bag.

Additionally, as of June 1st, 2020, plastic bag fees have been instated.

Let's reduce kitchen waste.

Try not to throw away food, by consuming vegetables in a reasonable period and minding expiration dates.

Squeeze food well to reduce their liquid content before throwing them away.

About food waste

We define food waste as any edible food that is thrown away.

In Japan, 132 g per day per person of food (about the amount of a bowl of rice) is thrown away due to passed expiration dates and unwanted leftovers.

It adds up to as much as 6.12 million tons a year. (2017)

Please review your lifestyle at home and cooperate to reduce food waste.

Tips which can be done at your home

Let's begin to reduce food waste from now on.

Home edition

An important point is to buy only the amount of food that is needed and be sure to eat it all.

Buy

Check your refrigerator beforehand.

Notes or pictures taken with a cell phone would be very helpful.

Buy just the amount of food that is needed.

Do not buy excessive amounts of food.

Choose foods that are positioned up front when shopping.

Let's make meal plans with considerations for expiration dates.



Preserve

Store food properly.

Follow storage instructions for food and store them in the best place

Prepare food for preservation at the same time.

Chill, dry, or use salt in order to preserve some foods.

Rolling stock

Place foods with sooner expiration dates closer to the front of your refrigerator.



Cook

Finish eating all of your food.

Leftovers can easily turn into food waste.

Don't cook more food than you can eat.

Be mindful of your physical condition and health as well.

Try to convince yourself to finish your food.

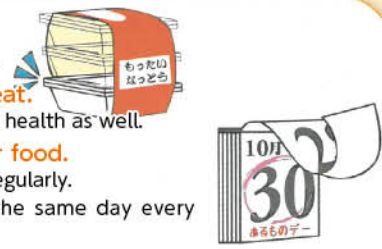
Try to check your refrigerator or pantry regularly.

(Example : Try to make casserole on the same day every month by using leftovers)

If you cannot finish eating leftovers, using the ingredients to make a new dish would be a great idea. Let's reconsider menus and recipes.

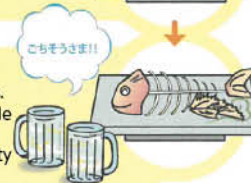

About garbage from business sites



Business sites have a responsibility to dispose of garbage by themselves.

It is for this reason that the city does not collect garbage from business sites.

We ask all businesses, companies, or factories to refrain from disposing of their garbage at the garbage collection sites of the city.

Please be aware of accountability and dispose of waste properly.

One idea is to contact waste disposal companies directly so that they can collect your garbage.

About illegal dumping

Illegal dumping is a crime.



It is prohibited by Waste Disposal and Public Cleansing Law.

If you violate this, you will be punished in the manner cited below.

A person who does illegal dumping (including attempted):

A maximum five years imprisonment and/or a maximum 10 million yen fine.



If a violator is a judicial person:

A maximum 300 million yen fine will be imposed.



If a subcontractor does an illegal dumping, an entruster will also be punished.

About disposal of illegally dumped waste

The priority order of those who are responsible for removing waste is as follows. The actual offender, an occupant of the land and building (if there is no occupant, an administrator is responsible).

As a general rule, the city will not remove any dumped waste, other than waste that comes from the land that it administers.

To prevent illegal dumping

We want every land administrator to try not to trigger illegal dumping. For example, try keeping grass cut low or enclosing your land with ropes. We want every citizen to be aware and alert to prevent illegal dumping.

About outdoor burning

Outdoor burning is prohibited.

Recently we have gotten many complaints about smoke and smells caused by outdoor burning.

Outdoor burning will lead to trouble with neighbors. At the same time, it will cause toxic dioxide and PM2.5.

In principal, outdoor burning is prohibited

Outdoor burning is prohibited by Waste Management and Public Cleansing Act but there are some exceptions. (Waste Management and Public Cleansing Act, Article 16-2)

Examples of violation: Burning of household waste on vacant land or fields

Burning waste on land or in a pit.

Burning waste using concrete blocks or oil drums

Burning waste by using an incinerator which does not comply with standards.



If you violate:

A maximum 5-year imprisonment and/or a maximum 10 million yen fine.

(Waste Management and Public Cleansing Act, article 25-1-15)

Exceptions

- ◆ When the burning is needed in order to manage a facility, only the country or local authorities are permitted in this case.
(Example : Burning of cut grass and wood by river administrator)
- ◆ When the burning is needed to prevent a natural disaster or to recover from one.
(Example : For an emergency measure or for a fire drill)
- ◆ When the burning is needed for a religious event or an annual event.
(Example : fire festival or Dondo-Yaki event)
- ◆ When the burning is needed for agriculture, forestry, or fishery.
(Example : burning of leaves, rice husks, straw, branches, etc. by farmers)
- ◆ Bonfire or slight burning of waste for daily living.
(Example : bonfire or barbecue as long as not disturbing others)

Even if the burning is considered an exception under these guidelines, if there's excessive smoke or smell that is considered a disturbance to others, the person responsible will be under advisory in order to maintain a comfortable living environment.

Cut trunks of trees, branches, grass, leaves, etc.
- ★Garbage which can not be accepted: **Please refer to page 12**
- ★How to carry-away Ordinary garbage should be sorted and placed in the designated plastic bags.
Bring in oversized garbage and cut branches as they are.
Caution: Dismantle the mattress of beds and separate the fabric from the metal springs.
